Featuring KOS



While you stay at Michelangelo Hotels & Resorts Group you can discover Kos is a beautiful Greek island, the third largest of the Dodecanese and a very popular holiday destination for travelers from all over the world.

It owes its name to the daughter of the mythical king Meropa, who was called Koos and it is the hometown of the Hippocrates (460-377 BC), known as a father of medicine.

The entire island looks like an open-air museum and it has many archaeological sites and monuments, as well as imposing buildings from the Italian period, which are worth visiting to experience its rich history

History (Hippocrates)

The great Greek doctor Hippocrates was born on the island of Kos in 460 BC (d. Larissa, 377 BC). He was the founder of scientific medicine, thus rightly earning him the name of "father of modern medicine" and a staunch proponent of "rational" medicine, i.e. one free of biases and superstitions.

According to the most reliable version of his biography in existence, Hippocrates was a student of his own father, who was a doctor as well and who trained him in medicine.

Hippocratic school of medicine revolutionized ancient Greek medicine, establishing it as a discipline distinct from other fields with which it had traditionally been associated (theurgy and philosophy), thus establishing medicine as a profession.

His contributions revolutionized the practice of medicine; but after his death the advancement stalled. So revered was Hippocrates that his teachings were largely taken as too great to be improved upon and no significant advancements of his methods were made for a long time. The centuries after Hippocrates' death were marked as much by retrograde movement as by further advancement. For instance, "after the Hippocratic period, the practice of taking clinical case-histories died out," according to Fielding Garrison.







Highlights best places to visit

The most famed archaeological site on the island of Kos is the Asclepeion, a healing temple, sacred to the god Asclepius that sits on the slopes of a low tree-covered hill. After 242 BC, the sanctuary of Asklepios was established as a place of refuge, and it was during this period that the Asklepian festivals were founded and subsequently held once every four years for musical and athletic competitions which were open to all Greek cities.

Natural Thermal Springs

One of the places that is definitely worth visiting are the natural thermal springs in Therma, located in the south-eastern part of the island, about 13 kilometers from Kos town and they got their name from the word thermos because of the heat of the water that springs up here and centuries.

The springs at Therma were discovered in 1934 by an Italian archaeologist and were created as a result of tectonic disturbances and volcanic eruptions millions of years ago. Although you can reach the point by public transport, you will need to walk another 10' to reach the beach. The natural thermal springs have therapeutic properties as they contain rich elements in calcium, potassium, sodium sulfur and magnesium which are considered decisive for the treatment of skin arthritic or rheumatic diseases. In addition, bathing in a hot spring helps with blood circulation and oxygenation of cells, helping the body's digestive and detoxification abilities. The herbal thermal springs at Therma are one of the most amazing locations on the island.

Ancient Agora

The ancient market place of Kos was considered one of the biggest in the ancient world. It was the commercial and commanding center at the heart of the ancient city. It was organized around a spacious rectangular yard 50 metres (160 ft) wide and 300 metres (980 ft) long. It began in the Northern area and ended up south on the central road (Decumanus) which went through the city. The northern side connected to the city wall towards the entrance to the harbour. Here there was a monumental entrance.

Gastronomy

Even the most demanding palates can be satisfied in Kos. On the island, in addition to traditional Greek cuisine and of course fresh fish, you can also find culinary options from international cuisine, as well as haute cuisine restaurants.

Both in the town and in smaller or larger areas of Kos, most restaurants offer good quality food, inspired by Mediterranean cuisine and Greek tradition, while there is no shortage of luxury restaurants with menus from the international culinary scene.

It is also worth trying local products, such as olive oil, wine, honey and fruits and vegetables, such as tomatoes, cucumbers, lemons, pumpkins, watermelons and other fruits and vegetables.

Also you should try: Labropites a traditional cheese pies with "Psofa" a fresh unsalted mizithra cheese that are usually prepared around Easter. Another recipe is Stuffed Tomatoes with Octopus (most of the times grilled but also stew and Varvara a thick, creamy wheat pudding based in an ancient Greek recipe.

Beaches

Tigaki beach has fine sand ad it's the ideal beach destination for water sports and beach games. Also is a great destination if you are seeking warm and shallow waters with fine sand.

Akti Zouroudi is one of the most popular beach on the island, full of beach bars, restaurants and cafes with lively atmosphere.

Mastichari Beach is an organized beach at Mastichari, which is the ideal spot for kite surfing.

Camel Beach is known for its rocky environment and is slightly secluded from the rest cosmopolitan area. It's the ideal place for those who want to relax and be isolated.

Kardamena Beach with its sparkling white sand is a popular tourist destination year after year.

Paradise beach, in Kefalos is the most famous beach of the island due to crystal clear sea. Paradise beach is a well organized beach with sunbeds and umbrellas in which visitors can enjoy various water sports.


There are daily and frequent ferryboat connections with Kos Island serving those island -hoppers flying from and to Kos International Airport.





The sponge-diving and rock-climbing island

Kalymnos the sponge-diving and rock-climbing island belongs to the Dodecanese and is located in the southeastern Aegean Sea, between the islands of Kos and Leros.

Currently is the world's most popular sport climbing holiday destination in the world, as it is blessed with top quality solid limestone.

The island is known as Càlino in Italian and Kilimli or Kelemez in Turkish.

History

The island is often referred to as the "Island of the Sponge Divers" and is considered as the center of the Greek sponge-diving industry, an activity that dates back to the Antiquity.

For many centuries, this on-going tradition has shaped the island's identity and contributed significantly to its financial prosperity and social development, while helping it achieve worldwide fame.


In the last two decades, rock climbing has been gaining traction on the island. It is a relatively new activity, not for the faint-hearted. Kalymnos has built its reputation on the variety and top quality of its rocks and, at present, it is considered as one of the most popular rock-climbing destinations worldwide.

Regardless of your level of expertise in rock climbing, there is always an opportunity for adventure. It is the ideal site with its tall, rocky cliffs towering over the breathtaking deep blue of the Aegean Sea.

In addition to rock climbing, the island offers a large array of interesting options, beautiful beaches, delicious cuisine and exceptionally friendly people.







Highlights best places to visit

The island's particular landscape makes it a favourable destination for alternative tourism: climb giant vertical rocks; explore centuries - old ship wrecks that lie in the sea-bed; discover enchanting caves; and visit wonderful beaches and picturesque island villages. That's what Kalymnos is all about.

Sponge Factory in Pothia Town

The Sponge Factory in Pothia is a reminiscence of the warehouses that spongers collected the sponges and processing them in large quantities and they were sold to natives or exported. The Sponge Factory in Pothia is the only one that remains to remind this tradition. This factory is open to visitors to get informed on the history of sponge-fishing, the methods used to dive, the process of elaborating sponges and to see from close enough workers elaborate sponges today.

Telendos is a Greek island in the southeastern Aegean Sea, belonging to the Dodecanese. It is approximately 1 km (0.6 mi) off the coast of the larger island of Kalymnos, of which it is administratively a part. Telendos was joined to Kalymnos, becoming separated from it in the 6th century AD following a series of earthquakes.

Gastronomy

In Kalymnos the visitors will find the opportunity to try a variety of recipes with fresh fish and seafood such as stuffed squid, karkani (a salad with mayonnaise and devil fish), fouskes,, sundried lobster tail, spinialo, an appetizer which includes scallops, sea urchins and devil fish maintained in seawater.

Also octopus dishes like octopus dipped in ouzo, octopus grilled or stew, octopus with macaroni or octopus croquettes.

Your visit to Kalymnos is a prime opportunity to taste the specialties of the island. The sweet delicacies, the savory flavors and the pure products coming from the Kalymnian land traditionally satisfy gourmets, who seek them back at every opportunity.

The agricultural products worth trying in Kalymnos are pure honey, citrus fruits (like grapefruits and bergamots), local sweet wine, called Anama, Eptazimo Bread (seven times kneaded bread) and the Eptazimo Cracker (seven times kneaded cracker). The most authentic product of Kalymnos though is the 'Krithini Kouloura' (barley bread).

Beaches

Kantouni Beach has a long sandy beach that is located 5 km north west of Pothia, the capital of Kalymnos, at a short walking distance from Panormos, but it can get a bit crowded sometimes.

Agios Soulas is a natural paradise with clear blue waters gently rolling into the sandy beach, it is the perfect destination for people looking to relax and be away from the city. Agios Soulas is a beach found 2km from Pothia, the capital of Kalymnos.

Arginonta beach is a sandy and pebbled beach of Arginonta is located 15km north of Pothia, the capital of Kalymnos and is coil up in a beautiful and picturesque bay.


Myrties beach is located 8 km north-west of Pothia, the capital of Kalymnos and from there little fishing boats sail to the opposite islet of Telendos.


Emporio is a well known serene beach located 24 km northwest of Pothia, that consists of smooth pebbles and crystalline waters and trees provide nice shade for those who prefer the more isolated spots.


Activities climbing, diving, sponges

Kalymnos is a popular rock climbing location with more than 3000 climbing routes set in the limestone rock of the island and a climate that allows climbing all year around. The island has seen a boom in climbing related tourism since 1997, when the Italian Andrea di Bari started establishing the first routes.

If you are in Kalymnos to climb, your first trip should be to the Outdoor Athletic Association (called such because they coordinate and track the climbing on the island). The association runs a small office north of Myrtes (near the Poets wall) and is open daily during the mornings. Here you'll be able to get the latest route information and a free print-out of the routes—a listing of the grades with directions on how to get to each crag, from there you'll find the routes as they are painted at the base of each route.







What you can experience in Kalymnos

April:

14-16: Celebration of Easter in Pothia (capital of Kalymnos). Also a representation of sponge-collection/ diving takes place in Pothia, including traditional food, music and dance.

June:

24 Feast of Agios Ioannis: At small bonfires are lit on the beaches and the harbors of the island and some people are jumping over them.

July:

26 Feast of Saint Panteleimon in Panormos. A big ceremony followed by a celebration at the monastery dedicated to the healing saint.


August:

15 Celebration of Holy Virgin (Panagia). At August 15th Kalymnos celebrates one of the highest celebrations in the Christian calendar, the feast day of Holy Virgin. Various ceremonies take place during that day and the day after.

September/October:

Rock climbing Festival (not confirmed for 2023)
